

- Challenge myself



  - broadens mind, positively changed attitude towards foreign countries








#### Goals








#### For who?

  - Already have some handson experiences and took some classes such as surgery and ophthalmology








## For how long?

• 4-7 week long externships in which the students will work directly with veterinary practitioners (most practitioners are board-certified or PhD) in North (Lombardy) and Central (Emilia-Romagna and Tuscany) Italy.












### When?

- flexible weeks over the summer (from June to August)
  - dates for 2017: from middle May to the beginning of August, and will depend on student's needs
  - Palio di Siena: two races per year **always** the 2<sup>nd</sup> of July and the 16<sup>th</sup> of August
- Suggested at least 4 weeks long
- Arrival/departure: flights to and from Italy will be scheduled by the student on a case-per-case basis (depending on externship dates and location)

• full immersion exposure to all aspects of commercial swine production (Prosciutto Crudo di Parma DOPG) in several farrow-to-finish facilities

- Clinical trials for pharmaceutical industries














# EQUINE SURGERY

## PlasmaLife

- Hyperimmune plasma manufacturer
- Herd of healthy, universal, hyperimmune donor horses
  - Tested for 16 infectious diseases
- Each bag has a minimum of 24 g/L of IgG and 50 g/L of total proteins
- The only entirely Italian produced plasma product approved by the Italian Health Ministry









# The Palio










### The Heart of Siena

- Siena is divided into 17 districts (contrade)
  - Loyalty to their *contrada* above church and state
- The contrade fiercely compete year-round, culminating in two annual events: *Il Palio di Siena* 
  - July 2<sup>nd</sup> and August 16<sup>th</sup>
- NOT just a horse race
  - Pride of the city
  - Glory or despair of a contrada
  - The Palio is the heart and life of Siena
  - They belong to their contrada first, Siena second, Italy third







#### The Race

- 10 of the 17 contrade compete
- Hired jockeys race bareback on a dirt track around the *Piazza del Campo*
- Three circles, 90 seconds
- Horse can win without a jockey!
  - The horse is more important to success than the jockey
- Horses are mixed breed, mares or geldings
- High speeds, sharp turns, hard ground all predispose a horse to injury




#### Pre-Race Exam


- Before the race, students participate in the examination of approximately
   100 horses over two days (at Il Ceppo)
- Examination divided into three stations:
- 1. Blood Draw and Records



2. Lameness Exam



3. Radiographs





#### Pre-Race Exam

- From the 100 examined, **32** horses are approved, and **10** are chosen to run in the Palio
- Contrade choose their horse via a lottery system
- The week before the big race, students attend two *prova*, or trial-runs, per day in the Piazza del Campo







# Palio Experience

- This is a truly unique, indescribable experience
- Appreciation for the culture unique to Siena, Italy
- Students have direct, hands-on experience with horses that are not only top equine athletes, but the representation of an entire district's pride and glory
- Enhancement of veterinary skills by participating in radiographic imaging, lameness evaluation, and competition monitoring



## But that's not all!

- During their stay at Il Ceppo, students also work with the hospital's day-to-day appointments and emergencies
- Experiences include:
  - Monitoring of Polo matches
  - Monitoring of races in adjacent towns ("mini-Palios")
  - Lameness exams
  - Radiology and ultrasonography
  - Donor plasmapheresis
  - Joint injections
  - Dystocia's
  - Orthopedic surgeries
  - And many other ambulatory and emergency medical procedures!

# What do you feel you gain from this externship?

#### Costs

- The cost of this trip can vary tremendously depending on the student (plane ticket, food, travel/excursions, souvenirs, pet boarding etc.).
- Students should expect to spend anywhere between \$5,000 and \$10,000.
- Round-trip plane tickets costs ~\$1,500 \$2,000,
- Car rentals for 4-6 weeks in Italy cost ~\$600 \$1,000
- Consider costs for boarding your animals
